**Modular exam:** These exams are made up of different modules. The candidate can decide which module(s) to take. Institutions and companies may require completion of all modules.

**Multilevel exam:** Unlike specific level exams, multilevel exams are intended to make a general diagnosis of the candidate's linguistic skills. Therefore, in the same exam there are questions for all linguistic levels, since there is only one version of the exam for all candidates in each exam session.

\*These exams assess the candidate's level, that is, candidates do not pass or fail. Based on the results obtained, the corresponding level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is certified. Institutions and companies may request a certain score.

**\*Scoring criteria** (except C.I.T.E., C.A.T. & D.A.T.): Exams are divided into two parts: Speaking, and Listening, Reading & Writing. To obtain the level certificate, a minimum score of 50% is required in each part (with the exception of the Masters level, which demands 55%). It is important to note that the Reading, Listening & Writing part calculates scores by averaging only if a minimum of 40% is achieved in each individual skill. This means that if a student scores 60% in Reading, 70% in Writing, and 40% in Listening, they pass the exam with an overall score of 56.6%. However, if the student scores 39% in Listening instead of the required 40%, they would not pass the exam, despite the average being 56.3%.

**\*Applied Translation Requirements:** To take the Diploma in Applied Translation (D.A.T.), candidates must have previously completed and passed the Certificate in Applied Translation (C.A.T.). Candidates for both exams must have a minimum of C1 level of proficiency in both languages (target language and source language).
